

HOW TO USE NALOXONE NASAL SPRAY

Use Naloxone nasal spray for a known or suspected opioid overdose in adults or children.



CALL 911 and lay person on their back.



PEEL open the package of Naloxone.



PLACE the tip of the device deep into either nostril.



PRESS the plunger firmly to release the dose into the person's nose.



ROLL the person gently on their side with their knees bent and head resting on their arm, on the floor.

Important Notes:

You may need to administer more than one dose of Naloxone if the person does not immediately revive.

Do not allow the person to leave before emergency medical attention arrives.

For use in the nose only, do not remove or test Naloxone nasal spray until ready to use.

Signs of an **OPIOID OVERDOSE**



Blue or purple lips or fingernails



Unresponsive to voice or touch



Pinpoint-sized pupils



Slow or irregular heartbeat



Slow or irregular breathing



Pale, clammy skin

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
